STATEMENT OF CHARGES

Pursuant to the General Statutes of Connecticut, §§19a-10 and 19a-14, the Department of Public Health (hereinafter "the Department") brings the following charges against Leslie Matejek:

1. Leslie Matejek of Derby (hereinafter "respondent") is, and has been at all times referenced in this Statement of Charges, the holder of Connecticut registered nurse license number E58736 .
2. On January 20, 2010, the Connecticut Board of Examiners for Nursing ordered a Consent Order in Petition No. 2009-0217-010-010 that placed respondent's license on probation for a period of four years. Such disciplinary action was based upon respondent's admitted falsification of a prescription for Oxycontin presented to the pharmacy at Griffin Hospital.
3. The Consent Order in Petition No. 2009-0217-010-010 was modified to extend respondent's probation by one year following violations of probationary terms when respondent tested positive for oxycodone on August 3, 2010, August 16, 2010 and September 14, 2010. The Modification of Consent Order in Petition No. 2010-5380 was ordered by the Board on June 15, 2011.
4. As a result of two positive morphine screens in August 2011, a hearing was held in Petition No. 2011-896. The Memorandum of Decision in that case, dated August 15, 2012, ordered respondent's license to remain on probation until February 1, 2015 under the terms and conditions of the modified Consent Order, Petition No. 2010-5380, dated June 15, 2011.
5. The modified Consent Order in Petition No. 2010-5380 specifically provides that respondent shall submit to observed random urine screens, which shall be negative for the presence of drugs and alcohol.
6. On June 19, 2013, respondent tested positive for oxymorphone, confirmed by GC/MS at a level of 221 ng/mL.
7. On June 25, 2013, respondent tested positive for oxymorphone, confirmed by GC/ml at a level of 216 ng/mL.
8. Respondent's abuse of controlled substances does, and/or may, affect her practice as a registered nurse.
