In re: Regina Rosa, R.N.

STATEMENT OF CHARGES

Pursuant to the General Statutes of Connecticut, §§19a-10 and 19a-14, the Department of Public Health (hereinafter "the Department") brings the following charges against Regina Rosa:

1. Regina Rosa of Farmington (hereinafter "respondent") is, and has been at all times referenced in this Statement of Charges, the holder of Connecticut registered nurse license number R40364.
2. At all relevant times, respondent was employed as a registered nurse at Hartford Hospital, Hartford, Connecticut.
3. From approximately September 1999 to March 2000 while working as a registered nurse at Hartford Hospital, respondent diverted Fentanyl for her own use, and falsified medication administration records.
4. Pursuant to a Consent Order dated August 16, 2000, respondent's license was suspended until October 31, 2000 and then placed on probation until October 31, 2004.
5. From approximately November 2004 through December 2004, while working as a registered nurse at Hartford Hospital, respondent:
 - a. diverted Fentanyl;
 - b. failed to completely, properly and/or accurately document medical or hospital records; and/or,
 - c. falsified one or more Controlled Substance Receipt Records.
6. From approximately November 2004 through December 2004, respondent abused or utilized to excess Fentanyl.
7. Respondent's abuse of Fentanyl does, and/or may, affect her practice as a registered nurse.
8. The above facts constitute grounds for disciplinary action pursuant to the General Statutes of Connecticut, §20-99, including but not limited to:
 - a. §20-99(b)(2);
 - b. §20-99(b)(5); and/or
 - c. §20-99(b)(6).

THEREFORE, the Department prays that:

The Connecticut Board of Examiners for Nursing, as authorized by the General Statutes of Connecticut, §§20-99(b) and 19a-17, revoke or order other disciplinary action against the license of Regina Rosa as it deems appropriate and consistent with law.
