CONSENT ORDER

WHEREAS, Patricia LaRosa (hereinafter "respondent") of Bristol, Connecticut has been issued license number 010125 to practice as a licensed practical nurse by the Department of Public Health (hereinafter "the Department") pursuant to Chapter 378 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, the Department alleges that:

1. Respondent was employed as a licensed practical nurse at Sheridan Woods in Bristol, CT.
2. Resident #1 had diagnoses that included atrial fibrillation and Parkinson's disease, was on aspiration precautions, and required supervision with eating.
3. On June 30, 2003, a nurse's aide reported that the resident appeared to be choking and/or having trouble breathing.
4. Respondent responded and used suction, but did not activate 911 or initiate the Heimlich Maneuver.
5. The above described facts constitute grounds for disciplinary action pursuant to the General Statutes of Connecticut, 20-99(b)(2).

WHEREAS, respondent, in consideration of this Consent Order, has chosen not to contest the above allegations of wrongdoing but, while admitting no guilt or wrongdoing, agrees that for purposes of this or any future proceedings before the Board of Examiners for Nursing (hereinafter "the Board"),

this Consent Order shall have the same effect as if ordered after a full hearing pursuant to §§19a-9, 19a-10, and 20-99(a) of the General Statutes of Connecticut.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to §19a-17 and §20-99(a) of the General Statutes of Connecticut, respondent hereby stipulates and agrees to the following:

1. Respondent waives her right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.
2. Respondent shall comply with all federal and state statutes and regulations applicable to her profession.
3. Respondent's license number 010125 to practice as a licensed practical nurse in the State of Connecticut is hereby reprimanded.
4. Legal notice of any action shall be deemed sufficient if sent to respondent's last known address of record reported to the Office of Practitioner Licensing and Certification of the Bureau of Healthcare Systems of the Department.
5. This Consent Order is effective on the first day of the month immediately following the month in which this Consent Order is approved and accepted by the Board.
6. Respondent understands this Consent Order is a matter of public record.
7. The Department's allegations as contained in this Consent Order shall be deemed true in any subsequent proceeding before the Board in which her compliance with §20-99(b) of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, is at issue.
8. This Consent Order and terms set forth herein are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, this Consent Order is not subject to appeal or review under the provisions of Chapters 54 and 368a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, provided that this stipulation shall not deprive respondent of any other

rights that respondent may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.

9. Respondent permits a representative of the Department to present this Consent Order and the factual basis for this Consent Order to the Board. The Department and respondent understand that the Board has complete and final discretion as to whether an executed Consent Order is approved or accepted.
10. Respondent has had the opportunity to consult with an attorney prior to signing this document.
11. The execution of this document has no bearing on any criminal liability without the written consent of the Director of the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit or the Bureau Chief of the Division of Criminal Justice's Statewide Prosecution Bureau.

I, Patricia LaRosa, have read the above Consent Order, and I agree to the terms set forth therein. I further declare the execution of this Consent Order to be my free act and deed.
