CONSENT ORDER

IN THE MATTER OF
JEANNE D. HYDE, L.P.N.

WHEREAS, Jeanne D. Hyde, L.P.N., of 36 Wauwinet Court, Guilford, Connecticut 06437, has been issued license No. 13545 to practice as a licensed practical nurse by the Department of Health Services pursuant to Chapter 378 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and

WHEREAS, Jeanne D. Hyde, L.P.N. hereby admits:

1. That she has violated the provisions of §20-99(b) of the General Statutes of Connecticut by unlawfully diverting 10 Percocet tablets, five Restoril tablets, and five Tylenol with Codeine $\frac{1}{2}$ gr tablets on February 9, 1982 and 1 Percocet tablet from patient Leroy Doane's container N-15459 on February 11, 1982 while she was on duty as a licensed practical nurse at Ferry Point Skilled Nursing Facility at 175 Ferry Road, Old Saybrook, Connecticut.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to §19a-17 and §20-99 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, Jeanne D. Hyde, L.P.N., hereby stipulates and agrees to the following:

1. That she waives her right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.
2. That her license, No. 13545, to practice as a licensed practical nurse in the State of Connecticut, is suspended for one year, effective the first day of the month following the date on which the seal of the last signatory is affixed to this document.

3. That her right and interest to license No. 13545 to practice as a licensed practical nurse in the State of Connecticut is relinquished during the period of said suspension.
4. That, as a condition precedent to the reinstatement of her license, she shall provide supportive evidence indicating she has been drug free for the period of said suspension; said evidence must include documentation from a licensed therapist indicating the dates of treatment and an evaluation of her progress and must contain a summary current to within one month of the application for reinstatement.
5. That, as a condition precedent to the reinstatement of her license, she shall meet the requirements for licensing at that time.
6. That this Consent Order may be considered as evidence of the admitted violations in any proceeding before the Board of Examiners of Nursing in which her compliance with this same order is at issue.
7. That she understands that notice of this Consent Order will be disseminated to the licensing bodies in other states.
8. That this suspension and the terms and conditions hereof are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack, or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, that said order is not subject to appeal under the provisions of Chapters 54 or 378 of

the General Statutes of Connecticut, provided that this stipulation shall not deprive her of any other rights that she may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.

- 9. That she understands that she has the right to consult with an attorney prior to signing this document.

I, Jeanne D. Hyde, L.P.N., hereby affix my signature, agreeing and admitting to the above, and declare this agreement to be an act performed of my own free will.
