**REINSTATEMENT CONSENT ORDER**

WHEREAS, Suzanne J. Wulff of New Britain Connecticut (hereinafter "respondent") was issued license number 027501 on May 28, 1999, to practice as a licensed practical nurse by the Department of Public Health (hereinafter "the Department") pursuant to Chapter 378 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, respondent's license expired on August 31, 2005, and respondent has now applied to have said license reinstated by the Department pursuant to Chapter 368a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, respondent hereby admits and acknowledges that:

1. She failed to renew her license and was practicing as a licensed practical nurse from August 31, 2005, to the present without a CT license.
2. The conduct described above constitutes grounds for denial of respondent's application for reinstatement pursuant to §19a-14(a)(6) of the General Statutes of Connecticut.

WHEREAS, respondent, in consideration of this Reinstatement Consent Order, has chosen not to contest the above admitted violation at a hearing in front of the Board of Examiners for Nursing (hereinafter "the Board"). Respondent further agrees that this Reinstatement Consent Order shall

have the same effect as if ordered after a full hearing pursuant to §§19a-9, 19a-10, and 20-99(a) of the General Statutes of Connecticut.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to §§19a-17 and 20-99 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, respondent hereby stipulates and agrees as follows:

1. She waives her right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.
2. Respondent's license to practice as a licensed practical nurse shall be reinstated when she satisfies the requirements for reinstatement of her license, as set forth in §§ 19a-14-1 through 19a-14-5, inclusive, of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies, and this Reinstatement Consent Order is executed by all parties.
3. Respondent shall pay a civil penalty of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) by certified or cashier's check payable to "Treasurer, State of Connecticut." The check shall reference the Petition Number on the face of the check. Said civil penalty shall be payable at the time respondent submits this executed Reinstatement Consent Order to the Department.
4. Immediately upon issuance, respondent's license shall be reprimanded.
5. Respondent shall comply with all federal and state statutes and regulations applicable to her profession.
6. Respondent shall notify the Department of any change(s) in her employment within fifteen (15) days of such change.
7. Respondent shall notify the Department of any change in her home and/or business address within fifteen (15) days of such change.

8. Legal notice shall be sufficient if sent to respondent's last known address of record reported to the Practitioner Licensing and Investigations Section of the Healthcare Systems Branch of the Department.
9. Respondent understands this Reinstatement Consent Order may be considered as evidence of the above-admitted violations in any proceeding before the Connecticut Board of Examiners for Nursing in which (1) her compliance with this Reinstatement Consent Order is at issue, or (2) her compliance with §20-99 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, is at issue. Further, respondent understands that any discipline imposed by this Reinstatement Consent Order, except for a civil penalty, shall be reported to the National Practitioner Data Bank.
10. This Reinstatement Consent Order and the terms set forth herein are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, this Reinstatement Consent Order is not subject to appeal or review under the provisions of Chapters 54 or 368a of the Connecticut General Statutes provided that this stipulation shall not deprive respondent of any other rights that [s/he] may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.
11. This Reinstatement Consent Order is a revocable offer of settlement which may be modified by mutual agreement or withdrawn by the Department at any time prior to its being executed by the last signatory.
12. Respondent has the right to consult with an attorney prior to signing this document.
13. This Reinstatement Consent Order is a matter of public record.
14. The execution of this document has no bearing on any criminal liability without the written consent of the Director of the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit or the Bureau Chief of the Division of Criminal Justice's Statewide Prosecution Bureau.

I, Suzanne J. Wulff, have read the above Reinstatement Consent Order, and I agree to the terms and allegations set forth therein. I further declare the execution of this Reinstatement Consent Order to be my free act and deed.
