STATEMENT OF CHARGES

Pursuant to the General Statutes of Connecticut, §§19a-10 and 19a-14, the Department of Public Health (hereinafter "the Department") brings the following charges against Patricia Integlia:

COUNT ONE

1. Patricia Integlia of East Haven (hereinafter "respondent") is, and has been at all times referenced in this Statement of Charges, the holder of Connecticut licensed practical nursing license number 029657.
2. In or about October 2007, respondent abused or utilized to excess Percocet.
3. Respondent's abuse of Percocet does, and/or may, affect her practice as a licensed practical nurse.
4. The above facts constitute grounds for disciplinary action pursuant to the General Statutes of Connecticut, §20-99(b), including but not limited to §20-99(b)(5).

COUNT TWO


5. Paragraphs 1-2 are incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full.
6. On May 3, 2006, the Connecticut State Board of Examiners for Nursing (hereinafter "the Board") ordered a Consent Order in Petition Number 2005-0524-011-018 (hereinafter "the Consent Order") that placed respondent's licensed practical nursing license on probation for a period of four years. Such disciplinary action was based upon proof of respondent's diversions of Percocet and/or Vicodin, and falsification of controlled substance records.
7. Said Order specifically provided that respondent shall be responsible for the provision of written reports from her therapist. Such reports shall include documentation of respondent's drug and alcohol free status.
8. Respondent's therapist report for October 2007 states that respondent was abusing Percocet.

9. Respondent's conduct as described above constitutes violations of the terms of probation as set forth in the Consent Order, and subjects respondent's license to revocation or other disciplinary action authorized by the General Statutes of Connecticut, §§19a-17 and 20-99(b).

THEREFORE, the Department prays that:

The Connecticut State Board of Examiners for Nursing, as authorized by the General Statutes of Connecticut, §§20-99(b) and 19a-17, revoke or order other disciplinary action against the license of Patricia Integlia as it deems appropriate and consistent with law.
