CONSENT ORDER

IN THE MATTER OF  
ROBERT J. JANUSKA

WHEREAS, Robert J. Januska, D.P.M., 8 Church Street, Torrington, Connecticut has been issued license No. P89 to practice podiatry by the Department of Health Services pursuant to Chapter 375 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and

WHEREAS, Robert J. Januska, D.P.M., hereby admits:

1. That during 1980 he advertised himself as a marriage and family counselor.
2. During 1981 and 1982 he advertised himself as a psychologist.
3. During 1981 and 1982 he advertised himself as a child guidance counselor.
4. That this conduct violates §20-187a, §20-59(3) and §20-59(9) of the General Statutes of Connecticut.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to §19a-17 and §20-59 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, Robert J. Januska, D.P.M., hereby stipulates and agrees to the following:

1. That he waives his right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.
2. That he is hereby suspended from the practice of podiatry for two years, sentence stayed, with probation for two years for the violation of §20-187a of the General Statutes of Connecticut.
3. As a condition of probation he will submit quarterly sworn statements to the Board of Examiners for Podiatry and to the Hearing Office of the Department of Health Services that that he has neither practiced

in nor promoted himself in any profession except podiatry and that he has referred all patients seeking psychological services to a licensed practitioner who offers psychological services.

4. That his own personal, private office telephone number is presently also listed in the telephone directory as "The Holistic Center," and that he will switch over this telephone number to Robert M. Murphy, N.D. of Torrington, Connecticut, and obtain a new personal, private office telephone number forthwith.
5. That he is hereby assessed a civil penalty of One Hundred Dollars for failing to comply with the provisions of §20-187a of the General Statutes of Connecticut. Said penalty to be paid to the Treasurer, State of Connecticut, by certified check, forwarded to Hearing Office, 150 Washington Street, Hartford, CT 06106, within ten days after the effective date of this document.
6. That this consent order may be considered as evidence of the above admitted violations in any proceeding before the Board of Examiners in Podiatry (1) in which his compliance with this same order is at issue, or (2) in which his compliance with §20-59 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, is at issue.
7. That this consent order and terms set forth herein are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack, or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, that said order is not subject to appeal under the provisions of Chapter 54 and 370 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, provided that this stipulation shall not deprive him of any other rights that he may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.
8. That this consent order is effective the first day of the next month after which the seal of the last signatory is affixed to this document.

9. That he understands that he has the right to consult with an attorney before signing this document.

10. That he understands that notice of this consent order may be disseminated to the licensing bodies of other states.

I, Robert J. Januska, D.P.M. hereby affix my signature, agreeing and admitting to the above, and declare this agreement to be a act performed of my own free will.
