CONSENT ORDER

WHEREAS, Patricia Gangi of Wethersfield, Connecticut has made application to the Department of Health Services to be licensed as a registered Hairdresser/Cosmetician pursuant to Chapter 387 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and

WHEREAS, Patricia Gangi hereby admits and acknowledges that:

1. During Fall 1987 she practiced as a hairdresser and cosmetician at Shear Designs located in Glastonbury, Connecticut, where she is a part owner.
2. Her license to practice as a hairdresser and cosmetician in Connecticut lapsed approximately ten years ago.
3. By her actions described in paragraphs 1. and 2. above, she committed acts which fail to conform to the accepted standards of hairdressers and cosmeticians and she is subject to denial of licensure by the Department of Health Services under §19a-14 of the Connecticut General Statutes.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to §19a-14 of the Connecticut General Statutes, of Connecticut, Patricia Gangi hereby stipulates and agrees to the following:

1. That she waives the right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.

2. That when she satisfies the requirements for licensure as a hairdresser and cosmetician as set forth in Connecticut General Statutes §20-252 and/or §20-254, she shall be granted a hairdresser and cosmetician license.
3. That she is hereby reprimanded.
4. That she is hereby assessed a civil fine of \$200.00. Said penalty is to be paid to:

Payment of the aforementioned fine by certified check shall accompany this document upon execution by Patricia Gangi.

5. That this Consent Order is effective when accepted and approved by a duly appointed agent of the Department of Health Services.
6. That she understands that notice of this Consent Order is a matter of public record.
7. That she understands that this Consent Order may be considered as evidence of the above admitted violations in any proceeding before the Connecticut Examining Board for Barbers, Hairdressers & Cosmeticians (1) in which her compliance with this same order is at issue, or (2) in which her compliance with §20-263 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, is at issue.

8. That this Consent Order and terms set forth herein are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, that said order is not subject to appeal or review under the provisions of Chapters 54 or 368a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, provided that this stipulation shall not deprive her of any rights that she may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.
9. That she understands that she has the right to consult with an attorney prior to signing this document.

I, Patricia Gangi, have read the above Consent Order, and I agree and admit to the terms and allegations set forth therein. I further declare the execution of this Consent Order to be my free act and deed.
