CONSENT ORDER

WHEREAS, Thomas Williamson of Bridgeport, Connecticut made application to the Department of Health Services to be licensed as a registered hairdresser and cosmetician pursuant to Chapter 387 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and

WHEREAS, Thomas Williamson hereby admits and acknowledges that:

1. Since 1983 he has worked at and been employed as a hairdresser and cosmetician by Essanelle (a/k/a Saks Fifth Avenue Beauty Salon), located in Stamford, Connecticut.
2. His license to practice as a hairdresser and cosmetician in Connecticut lapsed over two years ago.
3. By his actions described in paragraphs 1. and 2. above, he committed acts which fail to conform to the accepted standards of hairdressers and cosmeticians and he is subject to denial of licensure by the Department of Health Services under §19a-14 of the Connecticut General Statutes.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to §19a-14 of the Connecticut General Statutes, Thomas Williamson hereby stipulates and agrees to the following:

1. That he waives the right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.
2. That when he satisfies the requirements for licensure as a hairdresser and cosmetician as set forth in Connecticut General Statutes §20-252 and/or §20-254, he shall be granted a hairdresser and cosmetician license.
3. That he is hereby reprimanded.
4. That he is hereby assessed a civil fine of \$100.00. Said penalty is to be paid to:

Payment of the aforementioned fine by certified check shall accompany this document upon execution by Thomas Williamson.

5. That this Consent Order is effective when accepted and approved by a duly appointed agent of the Department of Health Services.
6. That he understands that this Consent Order is a matter of public record.
7. That he understands that this Consent Order may be considered as evidence of the above admitted violations in any proceeding before the Connecticut Board of Examiners for Barbers, Hairdressers, and Cosmeticians (1) in which his compliance with this same order is at issue, or (2) in which his compliance with §20-263 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, is at issue.

- 8. That this Consent Order and terms set forth herein are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, that said order is not subject to appeal or review under the provisions of Chapters 54 or 368a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, provided that this stipulation shall not deprive him of any rights that he may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.
- 9. That he understands that he has the right to consult with an attorney prior to signing this document.

I, Thomas Williamson, have read the above Consent Order, and I agree and admit to the terms and allegations set forth therein. I further declare the execution of this Consent Order to be my free act and deed.




