CONSENT ORDER

WHEREAS, Valeria (Penney) of Putnam Connecticut has been issued license No. 34399, to practice as a hairdresser by the Department of Health Services pursuant to Chapter 387 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and

WHEREAS, Valeria Penney hereby acknowledges and admits:


1. That she is the proprietor of Teddy Bear Curls, Putnam, Connecticut.
2. That said premises were inspected on February 14, 1985 by Sophie Woodka of the Connecticut Department of Health Services and Beth MaComber of the North East Area Health District sanitarian.
3. That said inspection discovered that there was no disinfectant and the work surfaces showed dust present.
4. By her action described in (3) above has violated the provisions of §20-263 of the Connecticut General Statutes by failing to conform to the accepted standards of the hairdresser and cosmetician profession.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to §19a-17 and §20-263 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, Valeria Penney hereby stipulates and agrees to the following:


1. That she waives her right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.
2. That she is hereby reprimanded.

3. That she will maintain disinfectant on the premises and dust the shop regularly.
4. That she understands that notice of this Consent Order is a matter of public record.
5. That she understands that this Consent Order may be considered as evidence of the above admitted violations in any proceeding before the Connecticut Board of Examiners for Barbers, Hairdressers and Cosmeticians arising out of a subsequent series of facts (1) in which her compliance with this same order is at issue, or (2) in which her compliance with §20-263 of the General Statutes of Connecticut is at issue.
6. That she understands this Consent Order shall be considered dispositive of the matters herein described and is not subject to reconsideration or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, that said order is not subject to appeal under the provisions of Chapter 387 and Chapter 54 of the General Statutes of Connecticut.
7. That she understands that she has the right to consult with an attorney prior to signing this document.

I hereby affix my signature, agreeing and admitting to the above, and declare this to be an act performed of my own free will.


