CONSENT ORDER

WHEREAS, the Connecticut Examining Board for Barbers, Hairdressers and Cosmeticians (hereinafter "the Board") is a state agency charged with the regulation of the professional practice of hairdressing and cosmetology;

WHEREAS, Roberto D'Attilo, of Norwalk, Connecticut (hereinafter "respondent") owned and operated Scissors Sharp Salon in Norwalk, Connecticut and held license number 040158 as a hairdresser/cosmetician.

WHEREAS, Mario Llantin of Norwalk, Connecticut has at no time been issued a license to practice hairdressing and cosmetology by the Department of Public Health (hereinafter "the Department") under the General Statutes of Connecticut, Chapter 387;

WHEREAS, the General Statutes of Connecticut, §20-252 provides that no person shall engage in the practice of hairdressing and cosmetology in this State until he is issued a license by the Department;

WHEREAS, respondent admits that, during 2001, he employed Mario Llantin, an unlicensed hairdresser who was engaged in the practice of hairdressing and cosmetology without having a valid license to do so;

WHEREAS, the Board is authorized by the General Statutes of Connecticut §19a-11 to issue an appropriate order to any person found to be violating an applicable statute; and,


WHEREAS, respondent agrees that the above allegations shall have the same effect as if proven and ordered after a full hearing held pursuant to §§19a-9 and 19a-10 of the General Statutes of Connecticut.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to Chapter 387 and §19a-11 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, respondent hereby stipulates and agrees to the following:

1. He waives his right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.
2. He agrees to cease and desist in the employment of non-licensed hairdressers who engage in the practice of hairdressing and cosmetology or in any other practice that requires licensure in the State of Connecticut without first obtaining an appropriate license.
3. Respondent shall pay a civil penalty of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) by certified or cashier's check payable to "Treasurer, State of Connecticut." The check shall reference the Petition Number on the face of the check, and shall be payable at the time respondent submits the executed Consent Order to the Department.
4. This Consent Order and terms set forth herein are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, that said Consent Order is not subject to appeal or review under the provisions of Chapters 54 or 368a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, provided that this stipulation shall not deprive respondent of any other rights that he may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.


4. This Consent Order is a revocable offer of settlement which may be modified by mutual agreement or withdrawn by the Department at any time prior to its being executed by the last signatory.
5. This Consent Order is effective after the last signature is affixed to this document.
6. Respondent permits a representative of the Legal Office of the Bureau of Regulatory Services of the Department to present this Consent Order and the factual basis for said Consent Order to the Board. Respondent understands that said Board has complete and final discretion as to whether or not an executed Consent Order is approved or granted.
7. Respondent understands that he has the right to consult with an attorney prior to signing this document.
8. This Consent Order is a matter of public record.
9. Respondent understands that this Consent Order may be considered evidence of the above admitted violations in any subsequent proceeding in which (1) his compliance with this Consent Order is at issue, or (2) his compliance with the provisions of Title 20 of the Connecticut General Statutes is at issue.

I, Roberto D'Attilo, have read the above Consent Order, and I agree to the terms and allegations set forth therein. I further declare the execution of this Consent Order to be my free act and deed.




