CONSENT ORDER

WHEREAS, Shawn C. Craig of New London, Connecticut ("respondent") was issued license number 049595 to practice hairdressing by the Department of Public Health ("the Department") pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Chapter 387, as amended.

WHEREAS, respondent admits:

1. In 2010, respondent employed two individuals who engaged in the unlicensed practice of hairdressing.
2. The above described facts constitute grounds for disciplinary action pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes §20-252.

WHEREAS, respondent, in consideration of this Consent Order, has chosen not to contest this matter and agrees that for purposes of this or any future proceedings before the Connecticut Examining Board for Barbers, Hairdressers and Cosmeticians (hereinafter "the Board,") this Consent Order shall have the same effect as if proven and ordered after a full hearing held pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes §§19a-10, 19a-14 and 20-252.


NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Chapter 386 and §19a-11, respondent stipulates and agrees to the following:

1. Respondent waives his right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.
2. Respondent's license number 049595 to practice as a hairdresser in the State of Connecticut is hereby reprimanded.
3. Respondent agrees to cease and desist in the practice of employing unlicensed individuals in any establishment or in any other practice that requires licensure.
4. Respondent shall pay a civil penalty of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) by certified or cashier's check payable to "Treasurer, State of Connecticut." The check shall reference the Petition Number on the face of the check, payable at the time respondent submits the executed Consent Order to the Department.
5. This Consent Order and terms herein are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, this Consent Order is not subject to appeal or review under Connecticut General Statutes, Chapters 54 or 368a provided that this stipulation shall not deprive respondent of any other rights that he may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or the United States.
6. This Consent Order is a revocable offer of settlement which may be modified by mutual agreement or withdrawn by the Department at any time prior to its being executed by the last signatory.
7. This Consent Order is effective after the last signature is affixed to this document.
8. Respondent permits a representative of the Legal Office of the Healthcare Quality and Safety Branch to present this Consent Order and the factual basis to the Board. Respondent understands that the Board has complete

and final discretion whether an executed Consent Order is approved or granted.


9. Respondent understands that he has the right to consult with an attorney prior to signing this document.
10. Respondent understands that this Consent Order is a public record.
11. Respondent understands that this Consent Order may be considered evidence of the above admitted violations in any subsequent proceeding in which (1) his compliance with this Consent Order is at issue, or (2) his compliance with the provisions of Connecticut General Statutes §20-252 is at issue.
12. The execution of this document has no bearing on any criminal liability without the written consent of the Director of the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit or the Bureau Chief of the Division of Criminal Justice's Statewide Prosecution Bureau. The purpose of this Consent Order is to resolve the pending administrative license disciplinary petition only, and is not intended to affect any civil or criminal liability or defense.
13. This Consent Order embodies the entire agreement of the parties with respect to this case. All previous communications or agreements regarding the subject matter of this consent order, whether oral or written, between the parties are superseded unless expressly incorporated herein or made a part hereof.

I, Shawn C. Craig, have read the above Consent Order, and I agree to the terms and allegations set forth therein. I further declare the execution of this Consent Order to be my free act and deed.


