CONSENT ORDER

WHEREAS, Soon Ja Son of Bayside, New York (hereinafter "respondent") was issued license number 052841 to practice hairdressing and cosmetology by the Department of Public Health (hereinafter "the Department") under the General Statutes of Connecticut, Chapter 387;

WHEREAS, respondent admits that:

1. While she was the owner and manager of Dove Spa & Nails in Norwalk, Connecticut she continued to employ an unlicensed massage therapist after being advised that it was illegal.
2. The above described facts constitute grounds for disciplinary action pursuant to the General Statutes of Connecticut, §20-263.

WHEREAS, respondent, in consideration of this Consent Order, has chosen not to contest this matter and agrees that for purposes of this or any future proceedings before the Connecticut Examining Board for Barbers, Hairdressers and Cosmeticians (hereinafter "the Board"), this Consent Order shall have the same effect as if proven and ordered after a full hearing held pursuant to §§19a-10, 19a-14 and 20-263 of the General Statutes of Connecticut.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to §§19a-14, 19a-17 and 20-263 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, respondent hereby stipulates and agrees to the following:

1. She waives her right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.
2. She agrees to cease and desist aiding and abetting the unlicensed practice of massage therapy.
3. Respondent's license number 052841 to practice hairdressing and cosmetology is hereby reprimanded.
4. Respondent shall pay a civil penalty of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) by certified or cashier's check payable to "Treasurer, State of Connecticut." The check shall reference the Petition Number on the face of the check, and shall be payable at the time respondent submits the executed Consent Order to the Department.
5. This Consent Order and terms set forth herein are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, that said Consent Order is not subject to appeal or review under the provisions of Chapters 54 or 368a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, provided that this stipulation shall not deprive respondent of any other rights that she may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.
6. This Consent Order is a revocable offer of settlement which may be modified by mutual agreement or withdrawn by the Department at any time prior to its being executed by the last signatory.
7. This Consent Order is effective after the last signature is affixed to this document.
8. Respondent permits a representative of the Legal Office of the Bureau of Healthcare Systems to present this Consent Order and the factual basis for said Consent Order to the Board. Respondent understands that said Board has complete and final discretion as to whether or not an executed Consent Order is approved or granted.
9. Respondent understands that she has the right to consult with an attorney prior to signing this document.

10. This Consent Order is a matter of public record.
11. The execution of this document has no bearing on any criminal liability without the written consent of the Director of the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit or the Bureau Chief of the Division of Criminal Justice's Statewide Prosecution Bureau.

I, Soon Ja Son, have read the above Consent Order, and I agree to the terms and allegations set forth therein. I further declare the execution of this Consent Order to be my free act and deed.
