In re: Susan Bennett, R.T.

WHEREAS, Susan Bennett of El Paso, Texas (hereinafter "respondent") has been issued license number 003376 to practice radiography by the Department of Public Health (hereinafter "the Department") pursuant to Chapter 376c of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, respondent admits that:

1. Between June 1, 1998 and July 10, 1998, respondent worked at New Britain General Hospital as a radiographer without first obtaining a license. Respondent was not granted a Connecticut radiographer's license until July 24, 1998.
2. Between June 1, 1998 and July 10, 1998, respondent used the title "radiographer" prior to obtaining a Connecticut radiographer's license.

3. The above described facts constitute grounds for disciplinary action pursuant to the General Statutes of Connecticut, §20-74bb, including, but not limited to:
  - a. §20-74bb(a); and/or
  - b. §20-74bb(f).

WHEREAS, respondent, in consideration of this Consent Order, has chosen not to contest this matter and agrees that for purposes of this or any future proceedings before the Department, this Consent Order shall have the same effect as if proven and ordered after a full hearing held pursuant to §§19a-10, 19a-14 and 20-74cc of the General Statutes of Connecticut.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to §§19a-14, 19a-17 and 20-74cc of the General Statutes of Connecticut, respondent hereby stipulates and agrees to the following:


1. Respondent waives her right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.
2. Respondent shall pay a civil penalty of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250) by certified or cashier's check payable to "Treasurer, State of Connecticut." The check shall reference the Petition Number on the face of the check, and shall be payable at the time respondent submits the executed Consent Order to the Department.
3. Respondent shall comply with all state and federal statutes and regulations applicable to her licensure.

4. Respondent shall pay all costs necessary to comply with this Consent Order.
5. This Consent Order is effective on the first day of the month immediately following the date this Consent Order is accepted and ordered by the Department.
6. Respondent understands this Consent Order may be considered as a public document and evidence of the above admitted violations in any proceeding before the Board in which her compliance with this Consent Order or with §20-74bb of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, is at issue.
7. This Consent Order is a revocable offer of settlement which may be modified by mutual agreement or withdrawn by the Department at any time prior to its being executed by the last signatory.
8. Respondent permits a representative of the Legal Office of the Bureau of Regulatory Services to present this Consent Order and the factual basis for this Consent Order to the Department. Respondent understands that the Department has complete and final discretion as to whether this executed Consent Order is approved or accepted.
9. Respondent has the right to consult with an attorney prior to signing this document.

I, Susan Bennett, have read the above Consent Order, and I stipulate and agree to the terms as set forth therein. I further declare the execution of this Consent Order to be my free act and deed.
