REINSTATEMENT CONSENT ORDER

WHEREAS, Gail DeCorso of Waterbury (hereinafter "respondent") has been issued license number 001458 to practice massage therapy by the Department of Public Health (hereinafter "the Department") pursuant to Chapter 384a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, respondent's license expired on August 31, 2002, and respondent has now applied to have said license reinstated by the Department pursuant to Chapter 368a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, respondent hereby admits as follows:

1. From about August 2002 through about March 2004 respondent practiced massage therapy without a license.
2. That the conduct described above constitutes grounds for denial of respondent's application for reinstatement pursuant to §19a-14(a)(6) of the General Statutes of Connecticut.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to §§19a-17 and 20-206b of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, respondent hereby stipulates and agrees as follows:

1. She waives her right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.

2. Respondent's license practice massage therapy shall be reinstated when she satisfies the requirements for reinstatement of her license, as set forth in §§ 19a-14-1 through 19a-14-5, inclusive, of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies, and this Reinstatement Consent Order is executed by all parties.
3. Immediately upon issuance, respondent's license shall be reprimanded.
4. The execution of this document has no bearing on any criminal liability without the written consent of the Director of the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit or the Bureau Chief of the Division of Criminal Justice's Statewide Prosecution Bureau.
5. Respondent shall comply with all federal and state statutes and regulations applicable to her license.
6. Respondent understands this Reinstatement Consent Order may be considered as evidence of the above-admitted violations in any proceeding before a Hearing Officer in which (1) her compliance with this Reinstatement Consent Order is at issue, or (2) her compliance with §20-206b of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, is at issue.
7. This Reinstatement Consent Order and the terms set forth herein are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, this Reinstatement Consent Order is not subject to appeal or review under the provisions of Chapters 54 or 368a of the Connecticut General Statutes provided that this stipulation shall not deprive respondent of any other rights that she may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.
8. This Reinstatement Consent Order is a revocable offer of settlement which may be modified by mutual agreement or withdrawn by the Department at any time prior to its being executed by the last signatory.

9. This Reinstatement Consent Order is effective when accepted and approved by a duly appointed agent of the Department.
10. Respondent has the right to consult with an attorney prior to signing this document.
11. This Reinstatement Consent Order is a matter of public record.

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I, Gail DeCorso, have read the above Reinstatement Consent Order, and I agree to the terms and allegations set forth therein. I further declare the execution of this Reinstatement Consent Order to be my free act and deed.
