CONSENT ORDER

WHEREAS, Thomas I. Mulryan, Embalmer, 59 Opal Drive, Glastonbury, Connecticut has been issued license number 2004 to practice embalming by the Department of Health services pursuant to Chapter 385 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and

WHEREAS, Thomas J. Mulryan hereby admits and acknowledges that:

1. On or about May 27, 1985 he was employed as an embalmer at Glastonbury Funeral Home, Inc.;
2. On or about said day he arranged with Elizabeth A. Leinert, the sister of John A. Hall, to handle said person's funeral;
3. He agreed with Ms. Leinert to make arrangements with the cemetery for a cemetery plot;

4. He failed to discuss with Ms. Leinert limitations of the plot relating to monument headstones;

5. By his actions in failing to discuss with Ms. Leinert any limitations relating to monument headstones, he negligently failed to conform to the accepted standards of the practice of embalming and thereby has violated the provisions of Conn. Gen. Stat. §20-227;

6. He has subsequently settled all differences with Ms. Leinert to their mutual satisfaction.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to §20-227 of the Connecticut General Statutes, Thomas J. Mulryan, hereby stipulates and agrees to the following:

1. That he waives the right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.

2. That in all future dealings with families of deceased persons in which he undertakes to order or arrange for cemetery plots on behalf of those families, he will ascertain limitations on those plots and disclose those limitations to those families.

3. That he understands that notice of this Consent Order is a matter of public records.

4. That he understands that this Consent Order may be considered as evidence of the above admitted violation in any proceeding before the Connecticut Board of Examiners of Embalmers and Funeral Directors (1) in which his compliance with this same order is at issue, or (2) in which his compliance with §20-227 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, is at issue.

5. That this Consent Order and terms set forth herein are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, that said order is not subject to appeal under the provisions of Chapter 54 or 368a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, provided that this stipulation shall not deprive him of any rights that he may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.

6. That he understands that he has the right to consult with an attorney prior to signing this document.

I, Thomas J. Mulryan, have read the above Consent Order, and I agree and admit to the terms and allegations set forth therein. I further declare the execution of this Consent Order to be my free act and deed.
