CONSENT ORDER

WHEREAS, William G. Iovanne, of 11 Wooster Place, New Haven, Connecticut has been issued license number 2176, to practice as an embalmer and funeral director by the Department of Health Services pursuant to Chapter 385 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and

WHEREAS, William G. Iovanne hereby acknowledges and admits that:

1. On or about 7 September 1986, he embalmed and buried the body of Maurice Candido, New Haven, CT, without having obtained a signed death certificate.
2. He buried the body of Maurice Candido without the necessary burial permit.
3. By his actions described in 1. and 2. above has violated the provisions of §7-62b, §7-64 and §20-227 of the General Statutes of Connecticut by failing to conform to the accepted standards of the embalmers and funeral directors profession.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to §19a-17 and §20-227 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, William G. Iovanne hereby stipulates and agrees to the following:


1. That he waives his right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.

2. That he is hereby assessed a civil penalty of \$100.00 for failing to comply with the provisions of §7-62b, §7-64 and §20-227 of the General Statutes of Connecticut. Said penalty is to be paid to the Treasurer, State of Connecticut, and forwarded to the Public Health Hearing Office, Department of Health Services, 150 Washington Street, Hartford, CT 06106. Payment of the aforementioned fine by certified check shall accompany this document upon execution by the respondent, William G. Iovanne.
3. That his license to practice as an embalmer is suspended for a period of one year from the effective date of this Consent Order.
4. That the one year suspension shall be stayed immediately and he shall be on probation for the remaining one year, and entitled to practice as an embalmer conditioned on the terms of probation as follows:
 - a. that he shall complete and file all certificates of death in accordance with §7-62b and §7-64 of the Connecticut General Statutes prior to final disposition of a body.
 - b. that he shall obtain all burial permits in accordance with §7-62b of the Connecticut General Statutes prior to final disposition of a body.
5. That violation of any of the conditions listed in 4.a. through 4.b., inclusive, will result in the summary suspension of his license by the Department of Health Services and the full one year suspension shall be in full force and effect.
6. That he does hereby permit any discussion which is necessary between the Public Health Hearing Office of the Connecticut

Department of Health Services, and the Board of Examiners of Embalmers and Funeral Directors regarding the final execution of this Consent Order.

7. That he understands that notice of this Consent Order is a matter of public record.
8. That this Consent Order is effective the first day of the next month after which the seal of the last signatory is affixed to this document.
9. That he understands that this Consent Order may be considered as evidence of the above admitted violations in any proceeding before the Department of Health Services (1) in which his compliance with this same order is at issue, or (2) in which his compliance with §20-227 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, is at issue.
10. That this Consent Order and terms set forth herein are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, that said order is not subject to appeal or review under the provisions of Chapter 54 or 368a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, provided that this stipulation shall not deprive him of any other rights that he may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.
11. That he has the right to consult with an attorney prior to signing this document.

I, William G. Iovanne, have read the above Consent Order, and I agree and admit to the terms and allegations set forth therein. I further declare the execution of this Consent Order to be my free act and deed.
