CONSENT ORDER

IN THE MATTER OF

DONALD SAGARINO

WHEREAS, Donald Sagarino, of New Britain, Connecticut has been issued license No. 0B5501 to practice as a funeral director by the Department of Health Services pursuant to Chapter 385 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and

WHEREAS, Donald Sagarino hereby admits and acknowledges that:


1. He falsely notarized an employee's certificate of completion of embalmer apprenticeship.
2. By his actions described in (1) above has violated the provisions of §20-227 of the Connecticut General Statutes by failing to conform to the accepted standards of the funeral director profession.

NOW THEREFORE, Pursuant to §19a-17 and §20-227 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, Donald Sagarino hereby stipulates and agrees to the following:


1. That he hereby waives his rights to a hearing on the merits of this matter.
2. That he is censured for the aforementioned violations of §20-227 of the Connecticut General Statutes.

3. That he is hereby assessed a civil penalty of \$400 for failing to comply with the provisions of §20-227 of the Connecticut General Statutes. Said penalty is to be paid to the Treasurer, State of Connecticut, by certified check, forwarded to the Hearing Office, Department of Health Services, 150 Washington Street Hartford, Connecticut 06106 within ten days after the effective date of this document.
4. That this consent order may be considered as evidence of the above admitted violations in any proceeding before the Board of Examiners of Embalmers and Funeral Directors, (1) in which his compliance with this same order is at issue, or (2) in which his compliance with §20-227 of the Connecticut General Statutes, as amended, is at issue.
5. That this Consent Order and terms set forth herein are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack, or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, that said order is not subject to appeal under the provisions of Chapters 54 or 385 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, provided that this stipulation shall not deprive him of any other rights that he may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.
6. That this Consent Order is a matter of public record.
7. That this Consent Order is effective the first day of the next month after which the seal of the last signatory is affixed to this document.
8. That he has consulted with an attorney before signing this document.

I Donald Sagarino hereby affix my signature, agreeing and admitting to the above, and declare this agreement to be an act performed of my own free will.




