CONSENT ORDER

IN THE MATTER OF

PETITION NO. 840720-~~24~~-003

GEORGE KELLEY

WHEREAS, George Kelley of Glastonbury, Connecticut has been issued subsurface sewage disposal system cleaner license No. 168, by the Department of Health Services pursuant to Chapter 393a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and

WHEREAS, George Kelley hereby admits and acknowledges that:

1. On or before June 24, 1984 he serviced a septic system at 779 New Britain Avenue, Rocky Hill, Connecticut.
2. In doing so he failed to properly open, inspect and clean the system.
3. By his actions described in (1) through (2) above he has violated the provisions of §20-341f of the General Statutes of Connecticut by failing to conform to the accepted standards of the subsurface sewage disposal system cleaner profession.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to §19a-17 and §20-341f of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, George Kelley hereby stipulates and agrees to the following:

1. That he waives his right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.
2. That he is hereby reprimanded.
3. That he is hereby assessed a civil fine of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) said penalty to be paid to the Treasurer, State of

Connecticut, by certified check forwarded to Hearing Office, Department of Health Services, 150 Washington Street, Hartford, Connecticut 06106 within ten days following the date that the last signatory is affixed to this document.

4. That he shall pay to Alice Peterson of 779 New Britain Avenue, Rocky Hill, Connecticut the amount of eighty five dollars (\$85.00) within 10 days following the date the last signatory is affixed to this document.
5. That he understands that notice of this Consent Order is a matter of public record.
6. That he understands that this Consent Order may be considered as evidence of the above admitted violations in any proceeding brought by the Commissioner of Department of Health Services (1) in which his compliance with this same order is at issue, or (2) in which his compliance with §20-341f of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, is at issue.
7. That he understands that this Consent Order is not subject to reconsideration or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further it is not subject to appeal under the provisions of Chapter 393a and Chapter 54 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, provided that this stipulation shall not deprive him of any other rights that he may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.
8. That he has the right to consult with an attorney prior to signing this document.

I, George Kelley, hereby affix my signature, agreeing and admitting to the above, and declare this to be an act performed of my own free will.
