CONSENT ORDER

WHEREAS, Anthony Sylvester of Waterford, Connecticut has been issued license number I-1956 to practice as a Subsurface Sewage Disposal System Installer by the Department of Health Services pursuant to Chapter 393a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and

WHEREAS, Anthony Sylvester hereby admits and acknowledges that:


1. He installed the septic systems at 222 Bloomingdale Road and 15 Pond Edge Drive, Waterford, Ct.
2. In both cases he commenced installing the system without obtaining the required permit from the town, although he did have the systems approved by the town.
3. It is the responsibility of the licensed installer to obtain the permit prior to the commencement of installation.
4. The failure to timely obtain this permit constitutes a violation of Connecticut General Statutes Section 20-341f(d).

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to Section 19a-17 and 20-341f(d) of the General Statutes of Connecticut, Anthony Sylvester hereby stipulates and agrees to the following:

1. That he waives the right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.

2. That he is hereby reprimanded.
3. That this Consent Order is effective the date said Consent Order is ordered and accepted by the Connecticut Department of Health Services.
4. That he understands that notice of this Consent Order is a matter of public record.
5. That he understands that this Consent Order may be considered as evidence of the above admitted violations in any proceeding before the Connecticut Department of Health Services (1) in which his compliance with this same order is at issue, or (2) in which his compliance with Section 20-341f(d) of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, is at issue.
6. That this Consent Order and terms set forth herein are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, that said order is not subject to appeal or review under the provisions of Chapters 54 and 368a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, provided that this stipulation shall not deprive him of any rights that he may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.
7. That he understands that he has the right to consult with an attorney prior to signing this document.

I, Anthony Sylvester, have read the above Consent Order, and I agree and admit to the terms and allegations set forth therein. I further declare the execution of this Consent Order to be my free act and deed.




