CONSENT ORDER

WHEREAS, William C. Bryant, of Plainville, Connecticut (hereinafter "respondent") has been issued license number 002820 to practice as a subsurface sewage disposal system installer by the Department of Public Health (hereinafter "the Department") pursuant to Chapter 393a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, the Department alleges that:

1. In or about the Fall of 1993, respondent was the licensed subsurface sewage disposal system installer at 4 Mountain Briar, Burlington, CT 06013 (hereinafter "the residence").
2. On or about said date, respondent failed to install the correct size infiltrator units for the system. Said failure resulted in the effective area of the leaching system being undersized by approximately 45 square feet under the Regulations, Connecticut State Agencies (hereinafter "the Regulations") and Technical Standards for subsurface sewage disposal systems in effect on said date.
3. In or about the October of 1998, the subsurface sewage disposal system at the residence failed. The undersized leaching system was a contributing factor, but not the sole factor, in the premature failure of the subsurface sewage disposal system.
4. The above described facts constitute grounds for disciplinary action pursuant to the General Statutes of Connecticut, §§20-341f(d)(2) and/or 20-341f(d)(3), taken in

conjunction with the Regulations §§19-13-B103d(a), 19-13-B103d(b) and Technical Standards VIII(E) and VIII(F). The Regulations were amended subsequent to the date the subsurface sewage disposal system was installed at the residence. Unless otherwise noted, all references are to those Regulations in effect prior to January 1, 1997.

WHEREAS, respondent, in consideration of this Consent Order, has chosen not to contest the above allegations of wrongdoing but, while admitting no guilt or wrongdoing, agrees that for purposes of this or any future proceedings before the Department, this Consent Order shall have the same effect as if proven and ordered after a full hearing held pursuant to §§19a-10, 19a-14 and 20-341f(d)(2) and/or (3) of the General Statutes of Connecticut.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to §§19a-14, 19a-17 and 20-341f(d)(2) and/or (3) of the General Statutes of Connecticut, respondent hereby stipulates and agrees to the following:

1. Respondent waives his right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.
2. Respondent's license number 002820 to practice as a subsurface sewage disposal system installer in the State of Connecticut is hereby reprimanded.
3. Respondent has voluntarily agreed to repair the system. Respondent shall repair the system in accordance the following terms and conditions:
 - a. Respondent shall install ten (10) infiltrator units to bring the effective area of the leaching system into compliance with the requirements of the Regulations in effect on the date this Consent Order is accepted by the Department, including, but not limited to Technical Standards VIII(E) and (F);
 - b. Respondent shall perform the repairs to the system in accordance with all current applicable requirements of §19-13-B103e of the Regulations in effect on the date this Consent Order is accepted by the Department;

- c. Respondent shall obtain the written approval to construct from the local Director of Health or his/her agent for the repairs to the system and provide a copy of such approval to the Department not less than one (1) week from the date of receipt of the written approval to construct;
- d. Respondent shall obtain the written permit to discharge from the local Director of Health or his/her agent upon completion of the repairs to the system and provide a copy of such permit to the Department not less than one (1) week from the date of receipt of the permit to discharge; and
- e. Respondent agrees that the repair of the system shall be completed on or before December 31, 1999, weather permitting and subject to cooperation of the homeowners.

- 5. Respondent shall comply with all state and federal statutes and regulations applicable to his licensure.
- 6. Respondent shall pay all costs necessary to comply with this Consent Order.
- 7. Any alleged violation of any provision of this Consent Order may result in the following procedures at the discretion of the Department:
 - a. The Department shall notify respondent in writing by first-class mail that the term(s) of this Consent Order have been violated, provided that no prior written consent for deviation from said term(s) has been granted;

- b. Said notification shall include the acts or omission(s) which violate the term(s) of this Consent Order;
 - c. Respondent shall be allowed fifteen (15) days from the date of the mailing of notification required in paragraph 7a above to demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Department that he has complied with the terms of this Consent Order or, in the alternative, that he has cured the violation in question;
 - d. If respondent does not demonstrate compliance or cure the violation by the limited fifteen (15) day date certain contained in the notification of violation to the satisfaction of the Department, he shall be entitled to a hearing before the Department which shall make a final determination of the disciplinary action to be taken; and
 - e. Evidence presented to the Department by either the Department or respondent in any such hearing shall be limited to the alleged violation(s) of the term(s) of this Consent Order.
8. In the event respondent violates any term of this Consent Order, said violation may also constitute grounds for the Department to seek a summary suspension of his license before the Department.
9. Legal notice shall be sufficient if sent to respondent's last known address of record reported to the Licensure and Registration Section of the Division of Health Systems Regulation of the Department.
10. This Consent Order is effective on the date this Consent Order is accepted and ordered by the Department.
11. Respondent agrees that this Consent Order shall be deemed a public document, and the Department's allegations as contained in this Consent Order shall be deemed true in any

subsequent proceeding before the Department in which his compliance with this Consent Order or with §20-341f of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, is at issue.


12. Any extension of time or grace period for reporting granted by the Department shall not be a waiver or preclude the Department from taking action at a later time. The Department shall not be required to grant future extensions of time or grace periods.
13. This Consent Order and terms set forth herein are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, this Order is not subject to appeal or review under the provisions of Chapters 54 or 368a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, provided that this stipulation shall not deprive respondent of any rights that he may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.
14. This Consent Order is a revocable offer of settlement which may be modified by mutual agreement or withdrawn by the Department at any time prior to its being executed by the last signatory.
15. Respondent permits a representative of the Legal Office of the Bureau of Regulatory Services to present this Consent Order and the factual basis for this Consent Order to the Department. Respondent understands that the Department has complete and final discretion as to whether this executed Consent Order is approved or accepted.
16. Respondent has the right to consult with an attorney prior to signing this document.

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


