CONSENT ORDER

WHEREAS, Michael Webber, S.S.I. of Sherman, Connecticut (hereinafter "respondent") has been issued license number 005018 to practice as a subsurface sewage disposal system installer by the Department of Public Health (hereinafter "the Department") pursuant to Chapter 393a of the Connecticut General Statutes, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, the respondent admits that:

1. In May 1993, respondent engaged in the activities of a subsurface sewage disposal system installer, and improperly installed a subsurface sewage disposal system at Lot #47, Bridle Ridge Road, Danbury, Connecticut. At that time, respondent did not have either a license or apprentice permit authorizing him to engage in such activities.
2. In June 1993, the Department issued respondent a license to practice the occupation of subsurface sewage disposal system installer pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Chapter 393a.
3. The facts set forth in Paragraph 1 above constitute grounds for disciplinary action pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 20-341f, including but not limited to Section 20-341f(a) taken in conjunction with Section 20-341f(d)(2) and/or (3).

WHEREAS, respondent, in consideration of this Consent Order, has chosen not to contest this matter and agrees that for purposes of this or any future proceedings before the Department the above allegations in this Consent Order shall have the same effect as if proven and ordered after a full hearing held pursuant to §19a-9, §19a-14, and §20-341f(d) of the General Statutes of Connecticut.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to §19a-17 and §20-341f(d) of the Connecticut General Statutes, as amended, Michael Webber, S.S.I., hereby stipulates and agrees to the following:

1. That he waives his right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.
2. That respondent shall pay a civil penalty of \$200.00, by certified or cashier's check payable to "Treasurer, State of Connecticut." Said civil penalty shall accompany this document upon execution by respondent.
3. All correspondence and reports are to be addressed to:

4. That he shall comply with all state and federal statutes and regulations applicable to his licensure.
5. That he understands that this Consent Order is a matter of public record.
6. That legal notice shall be sufficient if sent to respondent's last known address of record reported to the Licensure and Registration Section of the Division of Medical Quality Assurance of the Department.

7. That respondent understands this Consent Order may be considered as evidence of the above admitted violations in any proceeding before the Board in which his compliance with §20-341f of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, is at issue.
8. That this Consent Order and terms set forth herein are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, that this Order is not subject to appeal or review under the provisions of Chapters 54 or 368a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, provided that this stipulation shall not deprive respondent of any rights that he may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.
9. That this Consent Order is a revocable offer of settlement which may be modified by mutual agreement or withdrawn by the the Department at any time prior to its being executed by the last signatory.
10. That respondent permits a representative of the Public Health Hearing Office of the Division of Medical Quality Assurance of the Department to present this Consent Order and the factual basis for this Consent Order to the Board. Respondent understands that the Board has complete and final discretion as to whether an executed Consent Order is approved or accepted.
11. That respondent has the right to consult with an attorney prior to signing this document.


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
