CONSENT ORDER

IN THE MATTER OF

PETITION NO. 811211-~~03~~-007

CAROL IANNAONE-BORTOLOTT

WHEREAS, Carol Iannacone-Bortolot, 113 Yacht Street, Bridgeport, Connecticut has been issued license No. 769 to practice as a nursing home administrator by the Department of Health Services pursuant to Chapter 368v of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and

WHEREAS, Carol Iannacone-Bortolot, N.H.A., hereby admits and acknowledges:

1. That while she was employed as a nursing home administrator at Prospect Gardens Nursing Home, Norwalk, Connecticut, there existed instances of inadequate staffing;
2. That while she was employed as a nursing home administrator at Prospect Gardens Nursing Home, Norwalk, Connecticut, there existed instances of inadequate maintenance of supplies;
3. That while she was employed as a nursing home administrator at Prospect Gardens Nursing Home, Norwalk, Connecticut, there existed instances where safe and sanitary conditions were not maintained;
4. That, her responsibilities and duties as the nursing home administrator included, but were not limited to, ensuring adequate and suitable staff, adequate supplies, and safe and sanitary conditions, as reflected in the General Statutes of Connecticut §19a-517.
5. By her action described in (1) through (4) above has violated the provisions of §19a-517 of the Connecticut General Statutes by failing to conform to the accepted standards of nursing home administration.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to §19a-17 and §19a-517 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, Carol Iannacone-Bortolot, hereby stipulates and agrees to the following:

1. That she waives her right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.
2. That her license, No. 769 to practice as a nursing home administrator in the State of Connecticut is ~~suspended~~ for a period of ten years, said suspension to be retroactive to her June 29, 1981 resignation date from Prospect Gardens Nursing Home.
3. That during the term of said suspension she will cease and desist from practicing as a nursing home administrator in the State of Connecticut.
4. That said suspension shall be ~~stayed after five years~~, and she will then be placed on ~~probation~~ for the remaining five years, and entitled to practice as a nursing home administrator conditioned on the terms of probation set forth in (5a), (5b), and (5c) below.
5. That she further agrees that she will ensure:
  - (a) adequate and properly trained staff
  - (b) adequate and proper supplies
  - (c) safe and sanitary conditionswhile she is employed as a nursing home administrator.
6. That any violation of the terms of probation specified in (5a), (5b), or (5c) herein shall constitute a violation of probation and may result in the lifting of the stay of said suspension and the full ten year suspension shall be in full force and effect.
7. That this consent order may be considered as evidence of the above admitted violations in any proceeding brought by the Commissioner of

Health Services (1) in which his compliance with this same order is at issue, or (2) in which his compliance with §19a-517 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, is at issue.

8. That subject to satisfactory completion of the terms of the suspension and the terms of probation her license to practice as a nursing home administrator in the State of Connecticut shall be fully restored, effective June 29, 1991.
9. The she understands that notice of this Consent Order may be disseminated to the licensing bodies of other states.
10. That this consent order and terms set forth herein are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack, or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, that said order is not subject to appeal under the provisions of Chapter 54 and 368v of the General Statutes of Connecticut, provided that this stipulation shall not deprive her of any other rights that she may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.
11. That she has consulted with an attorney before signing this document.
12. That this consent order will be effective the first day of the next month after which the seal of the last signatory is affixed to this document.

I, Carol Iannacone-Bortolot, N.H.A., hereby affix my signature, agreeing and admitting to the above, and declare this agreement to be an act performed of my own free will.
