

Statement of Charges Pending (See Attached)

A Statement of Charges is the document that contains the Department of Public Health's allegations against a practitioner that result from a formal investigation of the practitioner. Unless a summary suspension has been granted or the practitioner is currently subject to the terms of a previous disciplinary action or other agreement (which would also be posted on this site), the practitioner is eligible to continue to practice without restriction while a Statement of Charges is pending. The Board or Commission, or the Department of Public Health for professions where there is no Board or Commission, will determine what discipline, if any, is appropriate.

STATEMENT OF CHARGES

Pursuant to the General Statutes of Connecticut, §§19a-10 and 19a-14, the Department of Public Health (hereinafter "the Department") brings the following charges against Daniel Simonetti, N.H.A.:

1. Daniel Simonetti of West Haven, Connecticut (hereinafter "respondent") is, and has been at all times referenced in this Statement of Charges, the holder of Connecticut nursing home administrator license number 000889.
2. At various times prior to May 27, 2010, respondent was the administrator of Clintonville Manor in North Haven, Connecticut.
3. While he was the administrator of Clintonville Manor, by acts of omission or commission, in violation of multiple provisions of applicable state and federal regulations, placed one or more residents in immediate jeopardy of abuse by staff, inadequate nutrition, and disregard of personal dignity and legal rights.
4. The above described facts constitute grounds for disciplinary action pursuant to the General Statutes of Connecticut, §19a-517(b), including but not limited to:
 - a. §19a-517(b)(3); and/or
 - b. §19a-517(b)(4).

THEREFORE, the Department prays that:

The Commissioner of Public Health, as authorized in §§19a-17 and 19a-517, revoke or order other disciplinary action against the nursing home administrator license of Daniel Simonetti as it deems appropriate and consistent with law.
