**PRELICENSURE CONSENT ORDER**

WHEREAS, Zaida Govan of Indian Orchard, Massachusetts (hereinafter "respondent") has applied for a license to practice as an alcohol and drug counselor to the Department of Public Health (hereinafter "the Department") pursuant to Chapter 376b of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, respondent admits that:

1. In 2005 respondent applied for certification as an alcohol and drug counselor. In her application respondent answered "no" to a question regarding criminal history. Certificate number 000503 was issued to respondent on January 11, 2006. In 2008 respondent submitted an application for licensure as an alcohol and drug counselor. On the second application respondent indicated she had a previous criminal history. Respondent provided documentation that she had successfully completed court-ordered probation in 1992.
2. The conduct described above constitutes grounds for the denial of respondent's application for licensure pursuant to §19a-14 of the General Statutes of Connecticut.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to §19a-14 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, respondent hereby stipulates and agrees to the following:

1. Respondent waives the right to a hearing on the merits of her application for licensure.
2. After satisfying the requirements for licensure as a licensed alcohol and drug counselor as set forth in Chapter 376b of the General Statutes of Connecticut, respondent's license to practice as a licensed alcohol and drug counselor will be issued.
3. Respondent's license to practice as a licensed alcohol and drug counselor in the State of Connecticut shall, immediately upon issuance, be reprimanded.


4. The execution of this document has no bearing on any criminal liability without the written consent of the Director of the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit or the Bureau Chief of the Division of Criminal Justice's Statewide Prosecution Bureau. The purpose of this Prelicensure Consent Order is to resolve the pending administrative license disciplinary petition only, and is not intended to affect any civil or criminal liability or defense.
5. This Prelicensure Consent Order embodies the entire agreement of the parties with respect to this case. All previous communications or agreements regarding the subject matter of this Prelicensure Consent Order, whether oral or written, between the parties are superseded unless expressly incorporated herein or made a part hereof.
6. Respondent shall comply with all state and federal statutes and regulations applicable to her license.
7. Respondent shall notify the Department of any change(s) in her employment within fifteen (15) days of such change.
8. Respondent shall notify the Department of any change(s) in her home and/or business address within fifteen (15) days of such change.
9. Legal notice shall be sufficient if sent to respondent's last known address of record reported to Practitioner Licensing and Investigations of the Healthcare Systems Branch of the Department.
10. Respondent understands that this Prelicensure Consent Order may be considered as evidence of the above-admitted violations in any proceeding before a Hearing Officer in which (1) her compliance with this Prelicensure Consent Order is at issue, or (2) her compliance with §20-74s(7)(r) of the Connecticut General Statutes, as amended, is at issue.
11. This Prelicensure Consent Order and terms set forth herein are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, this Prelicensure Consent Order is not subject to appeal or review under the provisions of Chapters 54 and 368a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, provided that this stipulation shall not deprive respondent of any other rights that she may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.


- 12. This Prelicensure Consent Order is a revocable offer of settlement which may be modified by mutual agreement or withdrawn by the Department at any time prior to its being executed by the last signatory.
- 13. This Prelicensure Consent Order is effective when accepted and approved by a duly appointed agent of the Department.
- 14. Respondent understands this Prelicensure Consent Order is a matter of public record.
- 15. Respondent understands she has the right to consult with an attorney prior to signing this Prelicensure Consent Order.

I, Zaida Govan have read the above Prelicensure Consent Order, and I agree to the terms and allegations set forth therein. I further declare the execution of this Prelicensure Consent Order to be my free act and deed.
