CONSENT ORDER

IN THE MATTER OF
DONALD GINAND, D.V.M.

WHEREAS, Donald Ginand, D.V.M. of 329 Federal Road, Brookfield, Connecticut has been issued license No. 717, to practice veterinary medicine by the Department of Health Services pursuant to Chapter 384 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and

WHEREAS, Donald Ginand, D.V.M. hereby admits and acknowledges:

1. In August 1983 he reported as fact a series of events regarding the care rendered to an animal that had died while being boarded at his kennel, while knowing said representations were not true.
2. That the conduct described in (1) violates §20-202 of the General Statutes of Connecticut.

NOW THEREFORE, Pursuant to §19a-17 and §20-202 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, Donald Ginand, D.V.M., hereby stipulates and agrees to the following:

1. That he hereby waives his rights to a hearing on the merits of this matter.
2. That he is hereby reprimanded.
3. That his license No. 717, to practice as a veterinarian in the State of Connecticut is suspended for a period of two days.

- a. Said suspension shall be for a period of forty-eight (48) consecutive hours;
 - b. Said suspension shall be in full force and effect for the forty-eight (48) hour period during the first full month in which this Consent Order is in effect.
4. That he will immediately cease and desist making misrepresentations of events regarding the care rendered to animals at his kennel.
5. That this Consent Order may be considered as evidence of the admitted violations in any proceeding before the Connecticut Board of Veterinary Registration and Examination (1) in which his compliance with this order is at issue, or (2) in which his compliance with §20-202 of the Connecticut General Statutes, as amended, is at issue.
6. That this Consent Order and terms set forth herein are not subject subject to reconsideration, collateral attack, or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, that said order is not subject to appeal under the provisions of Chapters 54 or 368a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, provided that this stipulation shall not deprive him of any other rights that he may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.
7. That he understands that notice of this Consent Order is a matter of public record and may be disseminated to the licensing bodies of other states.
8. That this Consent Order is effective the first day of the next month after which the seal of the last signatory is affixed to this document.
9. That he understands that he has the right to consult with an attorney prior to signing this agreement.

I, Donald Ginand, hereby affix my signature, agreeing and admitting to the above, and declare this agreement to be an act performed of my own free will.
