**REINSTATEMENT CONSENT ORDER**

WHEREAS, David M. Dragan of Rockfall (hereinafter "respondent") has been issued certification number 004402 to practice as an Emergency Medical Technician by the Department of Public Health (hereinafter "the Department") pursuant to Chapter 394d of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, respondent's certification expired on July 1, 2007, and respondent has now applied to have said certification reinstated by the Department pursuant to Chapter 368a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, respondent hereby admits as follows:

1. During September 2005 respondent diverted intravenous fluids and supplies from Hunter's Ambulance Service, Incorporated in Meriden, Connecticut. The Department initially contacted respondent about this case in April 2006.
2. In October 2007, respondent signed the Department's Statement of Professional History required for respondent's recertification. On the Statement, respondent answered "no" to a question as to whether respondent had ever been subject to, or currently have pending any complaint or investigation by any professional licensing body in any state.
3. That the conduct described above constitutes grounds for denial of respondent's application for reinstatement pursuant to §19a-14(a)(6) of the General Statutes of Connecticut.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to §§19a-17 and 20-206jj of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, respondent hereby stipulates and agrees as follows:

1. He waives his right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.
2. Respondent's certification to practice as an Emergency Medical Technician shall be reinstated when he satisfies the requirements for reinstatement of his certification, as set forth in §§ 19a-14-1 through 19a-14-5, inclusive, of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies, and this Reinstatement Consent Order is executed by all parties.
3. Respondent shall pay a civil penalty of two-hundred dollars (\$200.00) by certified or cashier's check payable to "Treasurer, State of Connecticut." The check shall reference the Petition Number on the face of the check. Said civil penalty shall be payable at the time respondent submits this executed Reinstatement Consent Order to the Department.
3. Immediately upon issuance, respondent's certification shall be paced on probation for a period of two (2) years under the following terms and conditions: Respondent shall provide his sponsor hospital and his employer at each place where respondent practices as an Emergency Medical Technician throughout the probationary period, with a copy of this Consent Order within fifteen (15) days of its effective date, or within fifteen (15) days of commencement of employment at a new service. Respondent agrees to provide reports from such employer quarterly for the duration of the probationary period, stating that respondent is practicing with reasonable skill and safety.

5. Respondent shall comply with all federal and state statutes and regulations applicable to his certification.
6. Respondent shall notify the Department of any change in his employment within fifteen (15) days of such change.
7. Respondent shall notify the Department of any change in his home and/or business address within fifteen (15) days of such change.
8. Legal notice shall be sufficient if sent to respondent's last known address of record reported to the Practitioner Licensing and Investigations Section of the Operations Branch of the Department.
9. Respondent understands this Reinstatement Consent Order may be considered as evidence of the above-admitted violations in any proceeding before a Hearing Officer in which (1) his compliance with this Reinstatement Consent Order is at issue, or (2) his compliance with §20-206jj of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, is at issue. Further, respondent understands that any discipline imposed by this Consent Order, except for a civil penalty, shall be reported to the National Practitioner Data Bank.
10. This Reinstatement Consent Order and the terms set forth herein are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, this Reinstatement Consent Order is not subject to appeal or review under the provisions of Chapters 54 or 368a of the Connecticut General Statutes provided that this stipulation shall not deprive respondent of any other rights that he may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.

11. This Reinstatement Consent Order is a revocable offer of settlement which may be modified by mutual agreement or withdrawn by the Department at any time prior to its being executed by the last signatory.
12. This Reinstatement Consent Order is effective when accepted and approved by a duly appointed agent of the Department.
13. Respondent has the right to consult with an attorney prior to signing this document.
14. This Reinstatement Consent Order is a matter of public record.
15. The execution of this document has no bearing on any criminal liability without the written consent of the Director of the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit or the Bureau Chief of the Division of Criminal Justice's Statewide Prosecution Bureau.




