REINSTATEMENT CONSENT ORDER

WHEREAS, Robert C. Turner of Niantic, Connecticut (hereinafter "respondent") has been issued license number 001082 to practice as a paramedic by the Department of Public Health (hereinafter "the Department") pursuant to Chapter 384d of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, respondent's license expired on December 31, 2003, and respondent has now applied to have said license reinstated by the Department pursuant to Chapter 368a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, the Department alleges the following:

1. On October 1, 1997 the Department issued respondent license number 001082 to practice as a paramedic. Said license expired on December 31, 2003, and lapsed due to non-renewal.
2. In approximately 1984, the Department issued respondent license number 840144 to practice as an Emergency Medical Technician-Intermediate. Said license expired on October 1, 1985 and lapsed due to non-renewal.
3. On April 1, 1976, the Department issued respondent license number 760729 to practice as an Emergency Medical Technician. Said license expired on October 1, 1987 and lapsed due to non-renewal.

4. From approximately December 31, 2003 until January 2005, he practiced as an Emergency Medical Technician for the Manchester fire Rescue-EMS Department without a valid Connecticut license.
5. That the conduct described above constitutes grounds for denial of respondent's application for reinstatement pursuant to §19a-14(a)(6) of the General Statutes of Connecticut.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to §§19a-17 and 20-206nr of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, respondent hereby stipulates and agrees as follows:

1. He waives his right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.
2. Respondent's license to practice as a paramedic shall be reinstated when he satisfies the requirements for reinstatement of his license, as set forth in §§ 19a-14-1 through 19a-14-5, inclusive, of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies, and this Reinstatement Consent Order is executed by all parties. Respondent shall not practice as a paramedic until he successfully completes the coursework and exams described in paragraph 4 below.
3. Respondent shall pay a civil penalty of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) by certified or cashier's check payable to "Treasurer, State of Connecticut." The check shall reference the Petition Number on the face of the check. Said civil penalty shall be payable at the time respondent submits this executed Reinstatement Consent Order to the Department.
4. Immediately upon issuance, respondent's license shall be placed on probation until the following requirements are satisfied:
 - a. Respondent shall successfully complete a Paramedic refresher course, pre-approved by the Department. Within fifteen (15) days of the completion of such

coursework, respondent shall provide the Department with proof, to the Department's satisfaction, of the successful completion of such course(s).

- (b) b. Respondent shall successfully complete the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMT) Paramedic practical and written exam. Within fifteen (15) days of the completion of said examinations, respondent shall provide the Department with proof, to the Department's satisfaction, of successful completion.

Respondent shall complete the above coursework and exams no later than eighteen months after the effective date of this Consent Order.

5. Immediately upon issuance, respondent's license shall be reprimanded.
6. The execution of this document has no bearing on any criminal liability without the written consent of the Director of the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit or the Bureau Chief of the Division of Criminal Justice's Statewide Prosecution Bureau.
7. Respondent shall comply with all federal and state statutes and regulations applicable to his license.
8. Respondent shall notify the Department of any change(s) in his employment within fifteen (15) days of such change.
9. Respondent shall notify the Department of any change in his home and/or business address within fifteen (15) days of such change.
10. Legal notice shall be sufficient if sent to respondent's last known address of record reported to the Practitioner Licensing and Investigations Section of the Healthcare Systems Branch of the Department.

11. Respondent agrees that this Reinstatement Consent Order shall be deemed a public document, and the Department's allegations as contained in this Reinstatement Consent Order shall be deemed true in any subsequent proceeding before the Department in which his compliance with this Reinstatement Consent Order or with §20-206nn of the General Statutes of Connecticut, as amended, is at issue.
12. This Reinstatement Consent Order and the terms set forth herein are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack or judicial review under any form or in any forum. Further, this Reinstatement Consent Order is not subject to appeal or review under the provisions of Chapters 54 or 368a of the Connecticut General Statutes provided that this stipulation shall not deprive respondent of any other rights that he may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.
13. This Reinstatement Consent Order is a revocable offer of settlement which may be modified by mutual agreement or withdrawn by the Department at any time prior to its being executed by the last signatory.
14. This Reinstatement Consent Order is effective when accepted and approved by a duly appointed agent of the Department.
15. Respondent has the right to consult with an attorney prior to signing this document.
16. This Reinstatement Consent Order is a matter of public record.


